Commercial Fishery for Vermilion Snapper Closed to Vessels Fishing in the South Atlantic Federal Waters on September 18, 2009

The commercial fishery for vermilion snapper in the South Atlantic federal waters is **closed, effective 12:01 a.m. (local time) September 18, 2009**, through December 31, 2009. NOAA Fisheries Service has determined the 2009 July through December commercial quota of 302,523 pounds of vermilion snapper will be reached by this date.

During the closure period, no person aboard a vessel for which a commercial permit for snapper-grouper has been issued may commercially fish for vermilion snapper in federal waters of the South Atlantic. During the closure, all harvest or possession of vermilion snapper in or from South Atlantic federal waters is restricted to the bag and possession limits and the sale or purchase of such fish is prohibited.

In addition, for a person on board a vessel for which a federal commercial or charter vessel/headboat permit for the South Atlantic Snapper-Grouper Fishery has been issued, these provisions of the closure for vermilion snapper would apply regardless of whether the fish are harvested in state or federal waters.

Closure of the commercial fishery for vermilion snapper in the South Atlantic complies with regulations implementing the Fishery Management Plan for the Snapper-Grouper Fishery of the South Atlantic Region and is necessary to protect the snapper-grouper resource.

The operator of a vessel with vermilion snapper in excess of the bag or possession limit aboard must have landed such vermilion snapper prior to 12:01 a.m., local time, September 18, 2009, and all sale or purchase of vermilion snapper must occur prior to 12:01 a.m., local time, September 18, 2009. The prohibition on sale or purchase does not apply to sale or purchase of vermilion snapper that were harvested, landed ashore, and sold prior to 12:01 a.m., local time, September 18, 2009, and were held in cold storage by a dealer or processor.
